NOTES

Gonzaga has appeared in post-season play for 16 of the last 17 years, including 13 trips to the NCAA Tournament in 1995, 1999 (Elite Eight), 2000 (Sweet 16), 2001 (Sweet 16), 2002 (First Round), 2003 (Second Round), 2004 (Second Round), 2005 (Second Round), 2006 (Sweet Sixteen), 2007 (First Round), 2008 (First Round), 2009 (Sweet 16) and 2010 (Second Round), and three trips to the NIT in 1994 (Second Round), 1996 (First Round) and 1998 (Second Round)...**Gonzaga returns four starters from a year ago – guard Demetri Goodson and Steven Gray, forward Elias Harris and center Robert Sacre...**the only starter the Bulldogs lost from last season is guard Matt Bouldin who was the 2010 West Coast Conference Player of the Year...Gonzaga finished the 2010 season ranked 22nd in the Associated Press and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today national polls...**Gonzaga appeared in its 13th consecutive West Coast Conference Tournament final in 2010, the second-longest streak of years making a final of a conference tournament among current conferences. The University of Kentucky went to the final of the SEC tournament for 14 successive seasons under Adolph Rupp (1939-52)...**The 11 straight West Coast Conference regular-season titles by Gonzaga moved the Bulldogs into a tie with Connecticut (1951-60 Yankee Conference) and UNLV (1983-92 Big West) for the second-longest conference regular season title winning streak in NCAA history. UCLA is first with 13 straight Pacific-10 Conference titles from 1967-79.
